COMMUNITY: INDIANA MATH AND SCIENCE ACADEMY NORTH serves the educational needs of Indianapolis at 7435 N. Keystone Ave. Indianapolis IN 46240. The school utilizes a K-12 grade level configuration. The student body is culturally diverse with a population that is 76% African-American, 10 % Multiracial, 8% Hispanic/Latino, 5% White, and 1% other.

SCHOOL: INDIANA MATH AND SCIENCE ACADEMY NORTH is a public charter school, which is funded by public sources and operated independently by a board of trustees under a charter granted by the Mayor’s office of Indianapolis. Management of IMSA North is served by Concept Schools NFP. INDIANA MATH AND SCIENCE ACADEMY NORTH is an accredited four-year College Preparatory School, opened in 2010 and is currently serving approximately 700 students. The purpose of the school is to fully prepare students to carry the torch of knowledge, freedom, and prosperity which is passed from generation to generation in this great country.

CURRICULUM: The academic program is organized on an 8 period schedule. A maximum load is 8 credits per year with students carrying eight, 45 minute classes on a daily basis. A minimum of 52 credits and 40 hours community service are required for graduation. Students earn 1 credit per semester or 2 credits a year for each class they take.

Graduation Requirements include:

English	8 credits , including English I, American English, World Literature, and British Literature. In addition to the courses listed here, only “AP English” or “college level English language arts courses” will be considered as an acceptable English credit.
Mathematics	8 credits , including Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, and Pre-Calculus
Science	8 credits , including 2 credits of Biology, 2 credits of Physics, 2 credits of Int. chemistry-physics, and 2 credits of Chemistry
Social Studies	6 credits , including 2 credits of World History, 2 credits of US History, 1 credit of Government and 1 credit of Economics
Physical Education	2 credit
Health	1 credit
Foreign Language	4 credits of some type
Fine Arts	2 credits (art or music)
Computer Technology	2 credits
Other Electives	11 credits , including 2 credits College & Career Composition, 40 hours of Community Service

Post-Secondary Enrollment Options Program (PSEOP): IMSA NORTH works with Ivy Tech Community College to offer courses to all eligible students. Students can earn college credits while they are in high school.

Advanced Placement Classes: PLTW, Dual/College credits, AP Spanish, AP US History and AP Modern World History are offered at IMSA North.

GRADING: A 4.0 scale is used with additional grade weights given to Honors/Advanced Placement courses.
